- What did the image on the cover suggest to you about the story? Was your first impression correct?
- The flashes are written from the points of view of four different characters. Which one do you find yourself feeling closest to? Which one do you find the least sympathetic and why?
- The novella presents a number of complicated family relationships. Pick one and analyse how it is presented. What techniques does the author use? Is there a narrative arc to the relationship?
- Choose one flash that's written in a non-traditional format. What does the format add to the scene? Is it effective?
- Do you think this story has a hero? If so, who is it and why?
- How is Frank's illness portrayed? Does it come as a surprise or were you
  expecting it from the beginning?
- The novella is titled Only About Love, but what is the role of love in the book?
